



Town of Wilson

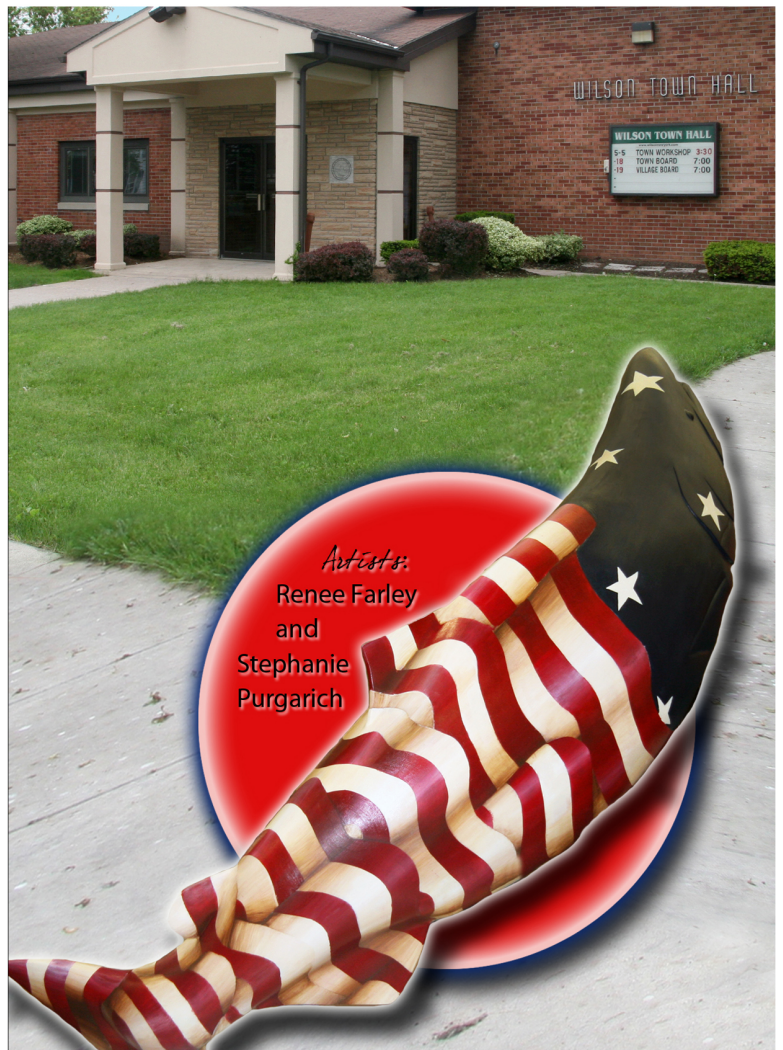
The fish owned by the *town of Wilson* will be displayed at the Town Hall, located at 375 Lake Street in Wilson, New York. The fish has a patriotic theme and was designed and painted by twelfth graders *Renee Farley* and *Stephanie Purgarich*.

The first Town Supervisor was *Reuben Wilson*, elected in 1819. The current Town Hall sits on the original site of the *Wilson Collegiate Institute*, which was established on January 25, 1845. Early settlers *Luther Wilson* and *Simon Sheldon* donated the land used for the cobblestone school. Later, in 1869, the site became home to the *Wilson Union Free School*, which employed five teachers.

Today, the officials serving the town include: *Joseph Jastrzemski* (town supervisor); trustees *Brad Clark*, *James Muscoreil*, *Tom Thompson* and *John Munnikhuysen*; town clerk *Wanda Burrows* and 1st Deputy Town Clerk *Diane Muscoreil*.

Hours for the Town Hall are Monday – Friday from 9-12 and 1-4. The website includes a map of Wilson, along with a calendar of events, a photo gallery and more.
